



Troop 272 – Leave No Trace Trainer

General Information

Type: Appointed by the Assistant Senior Patrol Leader with Guidance from the Scoutmaster

Term: 6 Month

Reports to: Scoutmaster and Den Leader

Description: Helps minimize impact on the land by teaching members the principles of Leave No Trace and improving Scouts' outdoor ethics decision-making skills.

Comments: Ensure we were never here.

Qualifications

Age: 14 years old or older

Rank: none

Experience: none

Attendance: 75% or better over the past 6 months

The assistant senior patrol leader may appoint a Scout, 14 years or older who has successfully completed the official 16-hour Leave No Trace Trainer training course, to serve as the troop Leave No Trace Trainer.

A Scout under the age of 14, or who has not completed Leave No Trace Trainer training, may serve as an instructor teaching Leave No Trace skills until he obtains the necessary training.

Confirmation: Appointment Approved by Scoutmaster

Performance Requirements:

Training: Being this is an elected position this individual needs to be trained at the Junior Training.

Effort: You are expected to give this job your best effort and use the adult leadership and advice when you feel they are needed.

Attendance: You are expected to attend 80% of all troop meetings, Patrol Leaders' Council meetings, outings, and service projects. If your attendance is low, or if you have three (3) unexcused absences in a row, you can be removed from office.

General leadership Responsibilities

Uniform: Set the example by wearing your uniform correctly. This means that you will wear all of the parts of the troop uniform, shirt tails tucked in, with all required badges in the correct locations.

Behavior: Set the example by being an active Scout and live the Scout Oath and Law as an example to others in everyday life. Show Scout spirit in everything you say and do. Obey and live the outdoor code.

Attendance: Set the example by being an active Scout. Be on time for meetings and activities. You must call the Senior Patrol Leader or Scoutmaster, if you are not going to be at a meeting or if you suddenly have to miss an outing. You also need to make sure that someone (A patrol leader if possible) is ready to assume your responsibilities. This requires you to "Be Prepared", plan ahead and this will never be an issue.

Specific Leadership Responsibilities

- Help minimize impact on the land by teaching members the principles of Leave No Trace and improving Scouts' outdoor ethics decision-making skills.
- At campouts, describe and demonstrate the principles of Leave No Trace.
- Attend an official Leave No Trace training course approved by the Council.
- Prepare and makes a presentation to the Troop on the principles of Leave No Trace.
