### General leadership Responsibilities

**Uniform:** Set the example by wearing your uniform correctly. This means that you will wear all of the parts of the troop uniform, shirt tails tucked in, with all required badges in the correct locations.

**Behavior:** Set the example by being an active Scout and live the Scout Oath and Law as an example to others in everyday life. Show Scout spirit in everything you say and do. Obey and live the outdoor code.

**Attendance:** Be punctual for meetings and activities. You must (call) notify the PL if you will be unable to attend a meeting or activity. You must ensure if you cannot make a meeting that the Patrol Leader will be attending and cover your position in your absence.

### Specific Leadership Responsibilities

- Gather food from the chow box with assistance from the Grubmaster and quartermasters if required.
- Organize the meal.
- Supervise helpers (if any).
- Make sure the meal is prepared well and on time.
- Assign cleaning up jobs for the pots, pans, and patrol cooking utensils.
- Set a good example.
- Wear the Scout Uniform correctly.
- Live by the Scout Oath and Law.
- Show Scout spirit.
